Winter School description

Overview

The Winter School is a collaborative initiative carried out by the University of Palermo (UNIPA) and the University of Baltimore (UBalt) and the result of a project co-funded by the Ministry of University and Research (MUR), on "Towards a Socio-Economic, Cultural, and Ecological Transition: A Dynamic Performance Governance Approach for Localizing Sustainable Development Goals" (*Verso una transizione socio-economica, culturale ed ecologica: un approccio di Dynamic Performance Governance per la localizzazione degli Obiettivi di Sviluppo Sostenibile*).

Students will be provided with an in-depth understanding of the localization of sustainable development goals (SDGs). To this end, students will gain knowledge and skills for fostering balanced long-term sustainability and resilience. A specific focus will be provided by efforts aimed at framing and comparing urban contexts like Palermo and Baltimore, characterized by unique socio-economic, cultural, and ecological profiles.

Objectives

By using a Dynamic Performance Governance approach, through an interdisciplinary view, students will analyze case studies to frame and localize the interconnections among the SDGs. The Winter School will also emphasize the "One Health" perspective, highlighting the interdependence of human and ecosystem health and promoting a collaborative approach to addressing global health risks.

Key Topics

The Winter School will cover strategies for shifting towards sustainable economic practices, the role of cultural changes in achieving sustainable development, and methods to enhance ecological resilience and sustainability. The program will delve into policy domains such as holistic integrated healthcare, and biodiversity conservation among other socio-economic and cultural areas.

Expected Outcomes

Participants will gain a comprehensive understanding of SDG localization. They will develop practical skills in comparing and assessing urban contexts to gain insights on how to design and implement place-based sustainable collaborative policies that may address cultural transition to meet socio-economic and ecological goals.

The Winter School also aims to prepare students to contribute effectively to the global sustainability agenda through innovative and interdisciplinary approaches.
