Diversity, Migration and Mediterranean Food: Mutual Interactions Among Cultures, Regions and Places

May 26th-30th, 2025 - UNIPA (Trapani University Campus)



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INTRODUCTION

The Blended Intensive Programme, intend to propose an inter-sectoral and multi-disciplinary intensive course entitled: "Diversity, Migration and Mediterranean Food: Mutual Interactions Among Cultures, Regions and Places". The BIP aims to examine the interaction between Mediterranean food, migrant cultures and the identity of places in the context of the Sicily region, which turns out to be a reality where different cultures converge and interact. The itinerary also aims to explore urban and rural spaces where the interaction between migrant traditions, cultures and Sicilian eno-gastronomic traditions generate new forms of production and value. The main objective is to understand the multidimensional dynamics of this process and to develop concrete strategies to promote coexistence, integration and valorization of the heritage involved.

The programme, driven by the collaboration of three departments (**DiSTeM**, **D'ARCH and SAAF**), is deeply rooted within the objectives and actions of two of the Forthem Alliance labs: **Food Science Lab and the Diversity and Migration Lab**, configuring itself as an operational and implementation tool with respect to the Labs' objectives. Also, the programme is mainly, but not exclusively, addressing European students to the nine Forthem universities and the project welcome around 25 students. As mentioned above, the approach to the proposed topic is interdisciplinary because it brings together different research profiles, ranging from experts in food, agronomy, biology, geography, urban planning, communication, history, pedagogy, sociology, law, anthropology, psychology and many

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others.

The course programme is developed according to a dual modality: a live session (in presence) in Trapani (May 26th to May 30th 2025) and an online session (June 30th to 4th July 2025).

For each days of the activity we will follow this main topics:

- Topic 1: Cultural diversity as intersectional identities in the Mediterranean regions
- Topic 2: Mediterranean food: environmental, social and economic sustainability
- Topic 3: Mediterranean food value chains: production, technology, packaging and health
- Topic 4: Migrants and Mediterranean food: tradition and innovation
- Topic 5: Migrant narratives, intercultural communication in the food productions
- Topic 6: Gender diversity and role of women in ethnic culinary cultures
- Topic 7: How do different migrant traditions interact with urban and/or rural space in food culture?
- Topic 8: Multicultural urban/rural spaces and food production
- Topic 9: Cultural intersections between different culinary traditions in Sicily
- Topic 10: The street food tradition in the urban spaces of the Mediterranean cities
- Topic 11: Importance of historic markets in the culture and urban development of the Mediterranean cities
- Topic 12: Diversity, stigma and exclusion in the food traditions/urban spaces

TEACHING METHODOLOGIES

The program will use the following teaching methodologies:

- Interactive lectures led by academic experts and professionals in the field
- **Practical case studies** illustrating the challenges and opportunities of migrant communities' eno-gastronomic productions in different cities around the world
- Site visits to places of food and wine production: Trapani
- **Applied workshops** involving students in designing innovative solutions to promote integration and improve the quality of life of migrant communities in relation to eno-gastronomic productions
- **Individual and joint research activities** that will allow students to integrate research activities carried out individually with joint paths directed by teachers and developed within thematic working groups (consisting of teachers, experts and students)

The programme, which provides for the recognition of **3 CFU** credits, has a significant applied laboratory component that will allow lecturers and students to experiment together with cooperative techniques and applied research activities.
