Abstract ~ While many Italian studies have examined the challenges associated with learning foreign languages, none have explored the effects of Foreign Language Anxiety (FLA). Additionally, there has been no comparison of whether different foreign languages might lead to varying levels of FLA among students with the same native language, such as Italian. Therefore, this research aims to assess the impact of FLA on studying English and Japanese within the Italian context.

Based on the literature analysis, numerous studies on foreign language (FL) learning have investigated the impacts of cognitive factors (such as working memory and attention) and emotional-motivational factors (like foreign language anxiety) on the FL learning process. However, the combined effect of these factors on the FL learning process remains unclear. This review seeks to address this gap by exploring the connection between anxiety and cognitive factors and their influence on foreign language learning.

Foreign Language Classroom Anxiety: A Comparison between Italian FL learners of English and Japanese**Reference:** Gullo, G., Gentile, A., & Alesi, M.

Many Italian studies focused on the difficulties that could arise in learning an FL, but no one investigated the impact of anxiety in Italian FL learners. Due to the lack of studies focused on assessing FLA levels in Italians FL students, this research aims to measure anxiety levels in two languages: English and Japanese.

Screening tools for Specific Learning Disabilities (SpLDs) are cost-effective and can be administered by teachers. However, using performance-based screening tools may lengthen the screening process. Self-report questionnaires could help to reduce screening time. Currently, there is a lack of self-report questionnaires available in Italy. The study aims to develop and validate a self-report questionnaire to assess school children's self-perceived academic learning difficulties.

Even though the two teaching styles have been extensively studied (Pakarinen et al., 2024), fewer studies have examined how individual factors influence teaching style. To the best of our knowledge, this study is the first attempt to create a self-report questionnaire to evaluate teaching styles based on the factors described by Stipek & Byler (2004).

The current study aims to analyze adaptive and non-adaptive teaching profiles, focusing on motivation, teaching styles, and teachers' variables. Additionally, it seeks to validate a self-report questionnaire that assesses teacher-oriented and student-oriented teaching strategies.
