RESEARCH STAY A.S. CENT UNIVERSITY OF PALERMO, 31 May-28 June 2024

The purpose of the research stay was to complete a chapter in a monograph on Human Rights and Development. A version of the chapter entitled "The Holders of the Right to Development" will also be included as a stand-alone piece in an edited volume published by Brill Publishers (publication date May 2025): Carol Ngang, Chairman Okoloise (Eds.), *International Covenant on the Right to Development: Implications for Developing Countries and the Global Balance of Power.*

I submitted the chapter to the Editors before the end of the research stay and attach a copy to this report (not for further use – text still subject to peer review). I have acknowledged the support from A.S.CENT at the outset of the chapter.

At the beginning of the stay, I attended a conference held at the Department of Political Science and International Relations on Cross-border Politics and Trade in the Horn of Africa. The seminar presented an opportunity to meet a number of colleagues at the Department. Subsequent contacts with Dr Luca Pudda led to a plan to return to the Department during the next academic year to organise a seminar on international investment law, sustainable development, and corporate responsibility from a local community perspective.
